Families and individuals wishing to sponsor the burning of one of the Sanctuary Lamps for a month should call the parish office and speak with Barb Schenauer, who also handles requests for Mass Intentions. An offering of \$100 is asked in order to sponsor this month-long remembrance of a deceased loved one or friend.

A special notation indicating in whose memory the Sanctuary Lamp is burning will appear every weekend in the bulletin in the same area as the weekly Mass Intentions.

The monthly offerings for lighting the Sanctuary Lamps are designated to offset the cost of candles used in our Church for worship.

The Domestic Church: A Quick Insight Learning Series

Over a number of weeks this summer, **Adult and Family Ministry** is running a bulletin quick insight learning series based on the chapter, "**The Domestic Church,**" in the book, "**Being Catholic in a Culture of Choice,**" by **Thomas P. Rausch, S.J.**, published by the Liturgical Press, Collegeville, Minnesota. Here is this week's quick insight: "*Pope John Paul II frequently spoke of the family as the domestic church, particularly in his Apostolic Constitution, Familiaris Consortio. He writes that...in the case of baptized people, the family, called together by word and sacrament as the Church of the home, is both teacher and mother, the same as the worldwide Church (no. 38). The Catechism of the Catholic Church also develops the idea of the family as the domestic church. It claims that...just as the Church is the family of God, believing families are of primary importance as centers of living faith (1656). Thus the home is the first school of Christian life (1657).*"

Get to Know: St. Dominic – St. Vincent de Paul: An Overview of Its Mission, Members, and Ministries

Over the next several weeks, this bulletin column will introduce you to the workings of the St. Dominic – Society of St. Vincent de Paul Conference (SD – SVDP) to learn more about the mission and ministries. If something attracts your interest, please call and leave a message at 262-781-3480, ext. 228. The SD – SVDP started in 1956 and is a part of an international organization, which was founded in 1833 by a group of Parisian college students. Today, the St. Vincent de Paul mission remains as it was at its founding: provide one-on-one ministry to people in need. According to our former Archbishop Timothy Dolan, “Men – and now, women, too – come together in this society first of all to strive for holiness. The St. Vincent de Paul Society is not a nice hobby, or a group of “do-gooders.” They see it as a way of life, as an invitation to follow Christ more closely, and thus consider prayer, the Eucharist, and the spiritual support of one another to be essential.”

At SD – SVDP, members (Vincentians) fulfill this mission through many direct and indirect ministries. Direct ministries involve one-on-one encounters with people in need (e.g., home visits, communion and rosary services, meal serving) while indirect ministries include activities supporting direct ministries (e.g., food pantry, delivery of bakery goods, parish pick-up, etc.). Vincentians have many varied backgrounds with one desire: to seek spiritual growth through service to others. While current SD – SVDP members are best described as middle age, our goal is to build membership more reflective of the adult parish. Members meet twice a month for reflection, organizing activities, sharing experiences, and prayer.

SD – SVDP direct ministries include: home visits, client assistance, nursing home visits, emergency assistance, twinning, food delivery, serving meals to homeless/lower income people, and a summer lunch program. Indirect ministries may also involve coordination with others in parish (e.g., Human Concerns, Boy Scouts) and include: delivering bakery

4 products, back-to-school drive,

Bundle Sunday, parish pick-up, supporting the Waukesha SVDP Council’s store on Main St., and providing Christmas presents to the children of inmates. Each of these ministries will be discussed in turn over the coming weeks. We look forward to sharing this with you!
