**A** ccording to an Advertising Age Magazine survey, the average American sleeps 8.6 hours a day.

The average worker spends one third of their day on the job. The number three activity for the average US citizen, after sleep and work, is watching TV. People are now spending at least 11% of their lives in front of the television set.

Everyone has a lot going on in their lives. It's tough to manage the job, the house, the family, the relatives, the friends. Sometimes we don't lead our lives, our lives lead us.

So what are your priorities? Do you have a clear vision of what's important to you?

Here's a test. Grab a pencil and a piece of paper. Now list your life's Top Ten Priorities. What's important to you? What matters most? Order your priorities from one to ten, with one being the most important in your life.

Now, evaluate the list. How much time do you dedicate to these priorities? Just because we say something is important doesn't mean it is. Look at the waking hours in a week. How many hours of a week do you spend on your Top Ten list? Do you find yourself dedicating time to things that are not even on your list?

Now look at your list again. Did your Top Ten List include prayer? If it did, how much time do you dedicate to prayer? If it didn't, where does prayer fit in your daily life?

As we continue our Lenten Journey, we concentrate on one of our three areas of focus: Prayer.

Prayer doesn't have to be something complicated or involved. It can be as simple as a morning meditation on your way to work, or an evening prayer as you lie in bed at night. It can be something you do alone in a quiet room, or together as a family around the dinner table. It can be formal or casual. You can read a book of prayers or Bible passages, or you can write your own prayers in a daily journal.

*It can be done anywhere, anytime, for any reason.*

So take another look at your list. Move some things around, revise your priorities, take control. After all, there is an off button on the remote control.

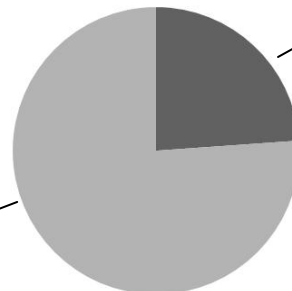

## February: The Month of the Holy Family

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to a certain devotion. In February, it is the Holy Family, the perfect example of family life for all Christians. Here is an activity to teach the children to consider what the Holy Family would do when faced with a difficult family situation.

**Materials**–Index cards with family-problem situations for group discussion

**Directions**–Pick an index card with a family problem to discuss. (Examples: It is Joey's turn to do the dishes and his Little League game starts right after dinner; Mom is sick and Dad has a business meeting to attend); Read the situation aloud and then ask the question, What would the Holy Family do? Come up with some solutions to the problem that would be in keeping with what the Holy Family would do. As a family decide on what would be the best solution; When finished, have a sharing time, pointing out how we can help our families by following the example of Jesus and his family.
